

# THE BURBANK RIFE & REVOLVER CLUB

The Burbank Rifle and Revolver Club, was organized in December 1925 and was Incorporated as a non-profit California Corporation in 1936. Faced with closure due to increasing population around the city of Burbank, the Club moved to its present location north of Castaic in 1955.

The range is now situated adjacent to the Angeles National Forest on 15 Club-owned acres and 80 acres leased from the Forest Service. The club features are a 25-yard pistol range, a 100-yard general-purpose range and a high-power range with butts at 200, 300, and 600 yards, a trap range, and a tree shaded area for camping and picnics.

## DUES AND INITIATION FEES

Annual dues for regular members are \$100 and the initiation fee of \$300 that is payable in three yearly installments of \$100 per year. The dues for seniors (those over 65) are \$25 with an initiation fee (if required) of \$100. If desired, dues and initiation fee payments can be paid in monthly installments of \$50.

Membership in the National Rifle Association is also required.

## FACILITIES

**High-power rifle range:** Single firing line with butts at 200, 300, and 600 yards.

**General-purpose range:** Approximately 10 firing points out to 100 yards. The firing line is tree shaded.

**Pistol line:** Approximately 10 firing points out to 25 yards. The firing line is also tree shaded.

**Trap line.**

**Picnic and overnight camping area:** Tree shaded campsites, primitive facilities. (Chemical Toilet, No Power).

# THE BURBANK RIFLE & REVOLVER CLUB

**Range:** Interstate 5 at Templin Highway.

**Mailing Address:** P.O. Box 90005, Los Angeles, CA 90009

**Directions to Range:** Proceed north on Interstate 5 to Templin Highway off ramp (approximately 5 miles past Castaic and at the top of a long grade). At the foot of the Templin Highway off ramp, turn right (east) then make an immediate left turn onto Paradise Ranch Road. Where the Paradise Ranch Road divides, stay to the right (up hill side). Continue past the stables where the pavement ends. Bear to the left and proceed up the narrow dirt road to the range. If in doubt, a good rule of thumb is to try and stay more or less under the high voltage power lines.
